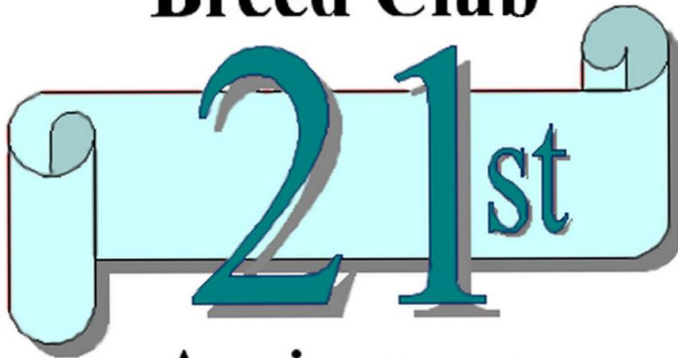

Short History of the Tonkinese Breed Club, Club Members & Tonks

Year	Notable Events
1990	12 th November - Guided by Mary S. Hodgkinson and Diana & Tommy Bishop, several Tonkinese breeders leave the Cat Association of Britain and apply to the GCCF for Preliminary recognition of the Tonkinese.
1991	21st April – Tonkinese Breed Club is inaugurated. GCCF Judge Alison Ashford is our first President. 11 th May – Preliminary breed recognition is granted thanks to the hard work of Mary, Diana and Tommy with the help of GCCF Secretary, Lesley Pring. October – Tonkinese begin winning their Merit Certificates in Assessment classes at GCCF shows.
1992	Work continues on the refinement of the breeding and registration policies.
1993	February – The TBC hold the first official Tonkinese breed seminar “ <i>The Way Forward For A New Breed</i> ”.
1994	April – The TBC Committee produce new Club rules and revise the Registration Policy. 26 th October – Now three years old, the TBC is affiliated with the GCCF. December – The TBC participates in the National Cat Club’s first ‘World Of Cats’ where biologist Roger Tabor features our Tonks in the BBC program about the National Show.
1995	5 th February – The Tonkinese Breed Advisory Committee is established under GCCF rules with the TBC Committee as its founder members. Chairman: Keith Scruton, Secretary: Carol Poole, Treasurer: Mike Vousden. 22 nd October – Open meeting held to review the Registration policy, with the object of moving forward as a Tonk x Tonk breed. Attended by members of the Tonkinese Breed Club and the newly formed Tonkinese Cat Club.
1996	7 th January – TBC/TBAC Tonkinese Breed Seminar attended by photographer Marc Henrie and renowned geneticist Roy Robinson (TBC honorary member). 2 nd November –TBC holds the first UK Tonk show &

	the world's first all Tonkinese pedigree cat show.
1997	Janine Davis's Orlick (74c) becomes the UK's first PAT CAT, soon followed by Buster (74) owned by Kathy Wilkinson.
1998	October – The Tonkinese SOP is greatly revised and includes the new Caramel and Apricot colours. <i>October – Award winning “Tonkinese Cats” is published; the first book to be written on the breed.</i>
1999	January – 1,394 Merits have been awarded to Tonks. TBAC Committee members Carol Poole, Chris Richards & Linda Vousden produce the application to promote Tonkinese to Provisional status. October – Provisional status granted, unanimously, by the GCCF Council, to commence in 2000.
2000	October GCCF Supreme – Doreen Burke's Tonkitu Flynn (74d) wins Best In Show, Provisional Breed.
2001	September – Our breed seminar is <i>“Perception of Tonkinese Type & Coat-Pattern”</i> - many judges ask “when will we apply for breed promotion?”
2002	Spring – On behalf of the TBAC Chris Richards & Linda Vousden prepare the application for breed promotion to Championship, sadly Carol Poole had passed away the previous year. 22 nd June – The GCCF Council unanimously approve our application. As of June 2003 the Tonkinese will be a Championship breed.
2003	<i>Our first titled Tonkinese -</i> Ch Bonzer Midnightviolet, F (74t), Iris Otto Ch Angisan Xcaliber Knight, M (74c), Chrissy Russell Pr Suantré Fatal Attraction, M (74t), Sue Arnold Pr Adinnsh Ricercar, F (74bt), Julia Craig-McFeely GrCh Tonkitu Flynn, M (74d), Doreen Burke GrCh Bonzer Midnightviolet, F (74t), Iris Otto GrPr Suantré Fatal Attraction, M (74t), Sue Arnold GrPr Tonkaholics Serendipity, F (74e), Kathy Wilkinson <i>Many more Tonks win their titles in our first Championship year – to see a full record of visit the Club web site: www.tonkinese.info</i>
2004	Diana Harper, becomes our Club President.
2005	February - the TBC propose “A deadline should be set for the cessation of registering the progeny of backcross

	<p>matings (Tonkinese/Tonkinese-variant with either Burmese or Siamese), the proposed date being 31st December 2007". The proposal is approved at the TBAC open meeting on 15th May – as of 1st January 2008 all kittens from a Tonk mated with any other breed will be registered as 'No Recognised Breed'.</p> <p>September – The TBC propose "The TBAC should now take active steps toward the full recognition of both the Tonkinese pointed and solid coat-patterns, as additional coat-patterns rather than variants".</p>
2006	<p>November – Our first Imperial, and only UK titled, Tonk– Karen Durden's Ch&IGrPr & UKGrPr Shinarha Enola Gay (74j), closely followed by IGrPr Episcopuss lanthe (74j).</p> <p><i>Throughout 2006 & 2007 the TBAC work on necessary revisions of the SOP and Registration policy.</i></p>
2007	<p>Our first Imperial GrCh – Chris & Jo Richards' IGrCh Tonkaholics Istar (74e)</p>
2008	<p>Spring – our first Imperial male Tonkinese – Kathy Wilkinson's IGrPr Mymystic Nimrod (74bt), closely followed by Val Chapple's IGrPr Mymystic Pagansun (74).</p> <p><i>The Tonkinese Breed Advisory Committee applies for GCCF promotion of our solid & pointed coat-patterns.</i></p>
2009	<p>The GCCF introduces titles for Household Pet Classes, Pedigree & Non-Pedigree, so solid & pointed Tonks may be entered in HHP pedigree classes.</p> <p>October – Our first titled pointed Tonk, Jo Hudson's MC Oscar (Tonkaholics Orion, 74v)</p>
2010	<p>April - Our first titled solid Tonk, John Bernard's MC Charlie (Mimaperks Champagne Charlie, 74dqv).</p> <p>October - Our first Grand Master Cat, Nikita Richards's GMC Cody (Tonkaholics Bufalobil Cody, 74av)</p> <p><i>October – "Tonkinese Cats – A History" is published; the first book to reveal the true history of the breed.</i></p>

PETS AS THERAPY

The earliest reported use of animal therapy for the mentally ill took place in the late 18th century at the York Retreat in England. Patients at this facility were allowed to wander the grounds which contained a population of small domestic animals. These were believed to be effective tools for socialisation. In 1860, the Bethlem Hospital (Bedlam) followed the trend and added animals to the ward, greatly influencing the morale of the patients living there. Sigmund Freud kept many dogs and often had his Chow present during his pioneering sessions of psychoanalysis. He noticed that the presence of the dog was helpful because the patient would find that their speech neither shocked or disturb the dog and so encouraged them to relax and confide in him.

Pets As Therapy is a national charity, which was founded in 1983. It is unique in that it provides therapeutic visits to hospitals, hospices, nursing and care-homes, special needs schools and a variety of other venues by volunteers with their own friendly dogs and cats.

There are currently over 4,500 active P.A.T. visiting dogs and 108 P.A.T. cats at work in the UK. Every week these calm, friendly animals give more than 130,000 people, both young and old, the opportunity and pleasure of cuddling and talking to them – over 6.75 million bedsides are visited each year.

All Pets As Therapy dogs and cats are required to pass a stringent assessment to check their health and temperament. So it hardly comes as a surprise to us that the UK's first P.A.T Cat was a Tonkinese - Orlick (aka Nahani Major Orlick), a lilac Tonkinese boy owned by Jeanine Davies. Shortly afterwards another Tonk joined the rare group of P.A.T Cats, Buster (aka Mymystic Starshadow), one of Kathy Wilkinson's brown boys.

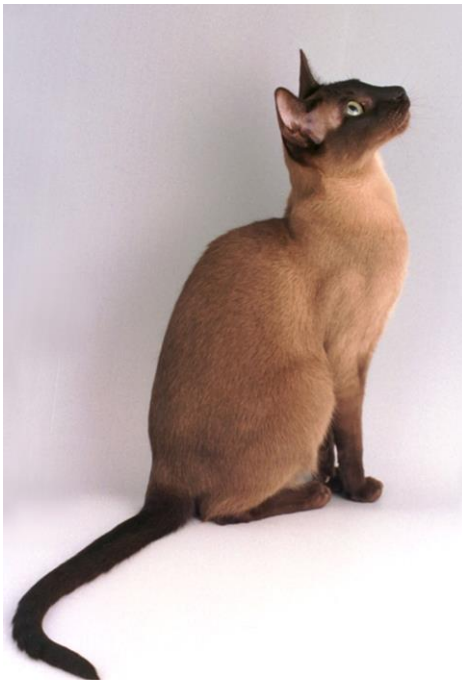
Sadly these wonderful and loving, cats have left us now, but both ladies are still members of the TBC and we are rightfully proud of them - and especially of Orlick and Buster who brought such pleasure and comfort to so many people. It is heartening to know that Tonks such as Jo Hudson's Hopeandglory, a pretty chocolate tabby girl, continue the Tonkinese P.A.T Cat legacy.

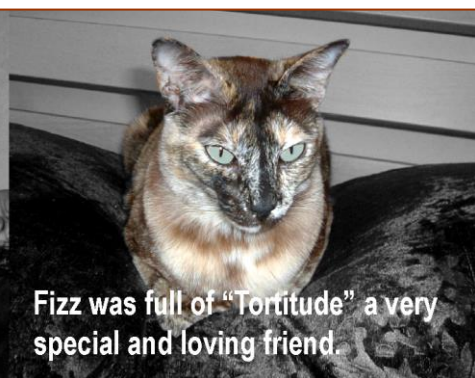
